

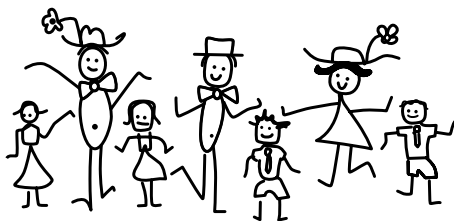

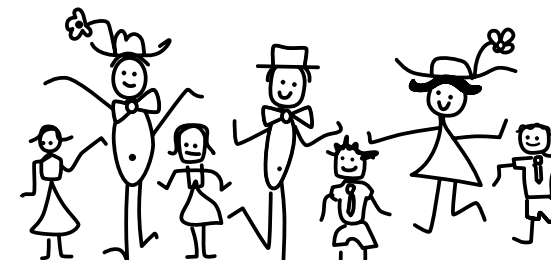

About Batemans

The Batemans Trust is a charity that supports
Anglo-Indian children in Chennai, South India.
Money raised by the Trust goes towards three
main projects:

Batemans Open School: This officially opened
in 2009 and is designed for children who have
had no previous schooling or who have been
struggling in their studies at other schools.

St George's Boarding Home: We enable
around 100 children to benefit from safe and
secure accommodation, good food, healthcare
and an education at St George's School and
Boarding Home.

Batemans Hostels: Our two hostels provide
education and training for children at our Open
School and for those who have left St George's
School and moved on to higher education or
vocational studies.

In all, we provide funding for more than 130
youngsters aged between five and 22.
